






Strategic location

- Vast territory full of opportunities: 281,748 km² (similar to Poland or Italy).
- South of Brazil, at the heart of Mercosul and on the border with Uruguay and Argentina.
- Access to the largest consumer markets in South America: 150 million inhabitants and 70% of the continent's GDP within 1,500 km of the capital Porto Alegre.

HDI of 0.771 - higher than the national average (IBGE 2021)


Qualified and productive workforce

- 5th highest number of highly qualified formal workers (Undergraduate or Graduate)
- Best federal university (UFRGS) and best private university in Brazil (PUCRS) (RUF 2023).
- 1st place in academic production in Brazil (with only 5% of the country's population)
- 2nd place in economic insertion of young people, according to the Ranking of Competitiveness of the States (2024)

LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE IN A DECADE

Average annual unemployment rate of 5.4% in 2023 (national average: 7.8%)



NUMEROUS AIRPORTS

- International airport operated by Fraport, with an extended runway (3.2km) for larger aircraft.
- State with the largest number of airports and regional connections (more than 20 routes)

INCENTIVES FOR AVIATION

Reduced taxes on QAV for companies expanding their **regional** and **international** air routes





Extensive infrastructure for national and international trade

PORT OF RIO GRANDE

- Port of Mercosur, one of the most important ports in South America for large ships, with a draft of 15m (49.2 feet).
- Main export destinations: China, USA, Europe and Argentina.

CONCERN FOR SUSTAINABILITY

- Signatory to the Green Ports Partnership with the Netherlands
- Reducing emissions and looking for new energy systems, such as H2V and wind power.

69.6 GW from 27 offshore wind projects add up to investments of around **R\$ 750 billion**


