# WTC to Host 5th Vintage, Classic and Modern Classic Car Fiesta in Mumbai

The World Trade Centre (WTC), Mumbai, will host the 5th edition of the Annual Vintage, Classic and Modern Classic Car Fiesta 2026 from January 24 to 26, bringing together some of the rarest and most iconic automobiles ever built. The event will be inaugurated on January 24, followed by public viewing on January 25, and will conclude with a ceremonial flag-off on Republic Day, January 26.

Announcing this at a press conference, Dr. Vijay Kalantri, Chairman, World Trade Centre, Mumbai and President, All India Association of Industries, said the Fiesta aims to reinforce the message of "Sadak Suraksha, Jeevan Raksha" while also celebrating India's rich automotive heritage. The event is being organised by WTC in association with the Vintage and Classic Car Club of India (VCCCI) and the Western India Automobile Association (WIAA).

"Last year, the event attracted over one lakh visitors. This year too, considering the enthusiasm

among people from all walks of life, from children to senior citizens, we expect a strong turnout. It is important that this heritage is shared with future generations while highlighting Mumbai's cultural significance as a classic city," Dr. Kalantri said.

Mr. Nitin Dossa, Chairman of VCCCI and WIAA, said the Fiesta will feature several rare

and historically significant automobiles, including from his own collection a 1933 Hudson, believed to be the only surviving example of its kind in the world.

Among the key attractions will be India's largest display of Rolls-Royce Phantom models from 1927 to the present day, and the historic return of Phantom I (17EX) after 95 years. The event, supported by JK Tyre, will also feature marques such as Rolls-Royce, Lamborghini and Dodge, reflecting strong public-private collaboration in promoting heritage, tourism and road safety.

The exhibition will also showcase rare collections from leading collectors including Mr. Yohan Poonawalla. The royal provenance section will include a 1937 Rolls-Royce Phantom III from the collection of late Shri Pranlal Bhogilal, a 1959 Jaguar Mark IX and a 1955 Bentley. Dr. Raghavpat Singhania's 1937 Rolls-Royce Wraith will arrive from Delhi, while Mr. Gautam Singhania will display a 1927 Rolls-Royce 20 HP Coupe and a 1928 Rolls-Royce Phantom I.
